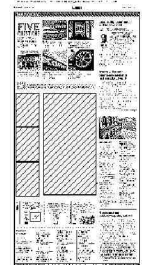

Southwest now offers Wi-Fi, movies, TV

Passengers on Southwest Airlines will now be able to use Wi-Fi and get access to an expanded selection of movies and television shows on most flights - for a fee.

The airline said Wi-Fi will be available for \$8 per device for any length trip. Travelers also will be able to watch movies on demand for \$5 per movie per device and see episodes of popular television shows for \$5.

Passengers have access to eight channels of live news and sports for free. Wi-Fi is not necessary to access on-demand movies and television shows.

As of Feb. 6, all Southwest Boeing 737-700s and 737-800s - about 75 percent of the fleet - were equipped with Row 44 satellite technology that enables the additional entertainment services. The Wi-Fi, movies and expanded television also will be installed on all new aircraft and conversions of AirTran, a subsidiary of Southwest.

Passengers can connect Wi-Fi-enabled devices by going to "southwestwifi" and launching their browser to be directed to the in-flight entertainment portal.
